PREFACE

Vidyasagar Teachers' Training College (VTTC), named after Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, is situated in the heart of the Midnapore town of now Paschim Midnapore District. The history of the college began in 1966, when the ex-students of Midnapore College in their annual reunion visualized the necessity of improving the art of teaching. The said ex-students felt the need of establishment of a training college, which would impart training to the science teachers. They set up steering committee with the then District Magistrate as its chairman, the principal-secretary, Midnapore College as its convener secretary, a few ex-students of Midnapore College, a few elites, educationists of the town as its members. The consensus of discussions combined with untiring efforts resulted the college into being from the 1st July, 1968 with the sanction of affiliation in Arts and Science [co-educational] by the university of Calcutta with an intake of 220 [Deputed students-100 & Fresher students-120] trainees.

In 1969, the college purchased its own land of 1.78 acres from Smt. Nalini Dinda, w/o Sri Pulin Bihari Dinda at Burdge Town, Midnapore. From the 1st June, 1985, the college affiliated to the Vidyasagar University with the same Arts and Science subjects. Since its inception, the college is significantly engaged in training the teachers and would be teachers and has become one of the renowned training colleges in West Bengal.

The college has been affiliated by the UGC u/s 2(f) from its inception and considered eligible to receive central government assistance through UGC u/s 12B. The college has earned for itself, the reputation of bearing premier institution for teacher education in the state of West Bengal. The college has earned the recognition from the NCTE with effect from the academic session 2007-2008 for running the B.ED. Course with an intake of 100 Vide No. ERC/ 7-73. 6(c) 2/2007/6224 dated February 9, 2007. Validation of the B.Ed. degree u/s 1803 of the NCTE Act, 1993 has also been made for the students of this college who successfully completed the course from 1995-1996 to 2005-2006 Vide No. ERC/ WB-S/V-72/06/4846 (I) & ERC/ WB-S/V-72/06/4845 (I) dated 08th December, 2006.

LAB FACILITIES

Laboratory is a place where anybody can experiment and explore patterns and ideas. We believe that the lab activities appeals to a wide range of learners, of different ages and varying proficiency. While the initial appeal is broad-based, the level of engagement of different individuals may vary. Keeping this foresight we wish to engage our student teachers in our enriched laboratories.

MATHS LAB

The mathematics laboratory is a place where anybody can experiment and explore patterns and ideas. It is a place where one can find a collection of games, puzzles and other teaching and learning material. The materials are meant to be used both by the students on their own and with their teacher to explore the world of mathematies, to





discover, to learn and to develop an interest in mathematics. The activities create interest among students or in anybody who wants to explore, and test some of their ideas, beliefs about mathematics.

The activities in the maths lab should be appealing to a wide range of people, of different ages and varying mathematical proficiency. While the initial appeal is broad-based, the level of engagement of different individuals may vary. The maths lab activities listed here have been done with students and teachers of different grade levels. The activities





are intended to give children an experience of doing mathematics and not merely for the purpose of demonstration.

The maths lab provides an opportunity for the students to discover mathematics through doing. Many of the activities present a problem or a challenge, with the possibility of generating further challenges and problems. The activities help students to visualize, manipulate and reason. They provide opportunity to make conjectures and test them, and to generalize observed patterns. They create a context for students to attempt to prove their conjectures.

It is important to note that while in science experiments provide evidence for hypotheses or theories, this is not so in mathematics. Observed patterns can only suggest mathematical hypotheses and conjectures, not provide evidence to support them. (Sometimes, they may help to disprove a conjecture through a counter-example.) Mathematical truths are accepted only on the basis of proofs, and not through experiment.

Mathematics laboratory is a place to enjoy mathematics through informal exploration. It is a place where anyone can generate problems and struggle to get a answer. It is a space to explore and design new mathematical activities. So, the maths lab should not be used to assess students' knowledge of mathematics. Often mathematics lab takes students knowledge beyond the curriculum.

Mathematics laboratory is a self-explanatory lab with activities, in which students could come anytime (free to them) and engage in the work, continue working on the problems/tasks, and use teachers as and when they are stuck. In this way, the role of the teacher is not to teach how to progress in the activity but to facilitate inquiry with the mathematics in it. The facilitation could be done either by probing questions, giving an extra resource or asking to follow or discuss with peers.

LANGUAGE LAB

The college has to its credit a well-equipped Language Laboratory under the aegis of Department of English, Bengali and Sanskrit to run the audio-visual mode of conducting communicative English. It has up-to-date software installed for each user separately. It significantly enhances the teaching-leaning process. The students are also facilitated through the screening of movies based on their texts.

PHYSICS LAB

Science is different than other subjects. It is not just the subject of science that is different; the entire process of doing science is different. The means by which knowledge is acquired is different in science than it is in history or mathematics or poetry

or other subjects. Science is different because the answers to scientific questions are not found in a textbook or through pondering high and lofty thoughts. Indeed, scientists ponder and hopefully think high and lofty thoughts; and indeed students in science class will find answers in a textbook. But the basis of what scientists believe and why they believe it is not the result of mere thinking or reading in a textbook. The basis of what scientists believe



is the result of the careful collection and analysis of laboratory evidence. In any physics class, the differentness of science will be most evident when it comes time for lab.

The college has excellent Physics laboratory where the students are trained to enhance their practical skills in physics. The laboratory is fully equipped with complete set of latest equipment and tools, which eaters to the need of the students and has experienced technical staff having necessary efficiencies.

CHEMISTRY LAB

Chemistry is essentially a practical oriented subject. No course in chemistry can be considered a complete without including some practical work in it. For proper understanding of chemistry, it should be taught using a large number of demonstration experiments. For caring out demonstration experiments and for the performance of practical's by the students a chemistry laboratory is a must for every teachers 'Training College offering physical se a subject. Like other science subject a chemistry laboratory is justified on the following groups:

- For chemistry laboratory the required apparatus and other apparatus etc, can be safely stored.
- As in other science subjects so also in case of chemistry. Laboratories are helpful in creating and promoting scientific attitude in the pupils.
- Laboratory provides a proper and congenial place for performing experiments and is helpful in developing a



sense of co-operation and spirit of healthy competition among the students.

EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY LAB

Vidyasagar Teachers' Training College was established in 1968. This Psychology Laboratory was established from very beginning. This Psychology Laboratory was developed at 2005.

The Main Purposes or objectives of Psychology Laboratory are:

- To enable the students to understand way of conducting psychological experiments.
- To give practical experiences to B.Ed. students teachers in regard to some of the psychological concepts and principles.
- To enable the B.Ed. students to apply scientific method for the solution of psychological problems in psychological laboratory.



- To give B.Ed. students living experience in regard in the conducting of psychological experiences in their class room situation in future.
- To apply the knowledge of various psychological experiments and tests in school situations.
- To apply the psychological tests in during research work.

LIFE SCIENCE LAB

The college has to its credit a well equipped Life Science Laboratory. It has 12 compound Microscopes for each student. There are many glassware and chemicals which facilitate the learning process. The Laboratory is housed in a large room with enough practical tables and tools for the students. The laboratory also has many models and charts



which enhances teaching-learning process. There is a steady Wi-Fi connectivity inside





the laboratory. The atmosphere inside the Life Science Laboratory creates a spirited environment conforming to the four pillars of education that is "Learning to do, learning to know, learning to be, and leaning to live together.

GEOGRAPHY LAB

Geography lab plays a pivotal role in enriching geographical base of a student- a necessary part of learning that exposes students to full spectrum of disciplinary subfields- physical, human and nature-society geography as well as geographical techniques. The lab is well equipped with a series of maps, topographic sheets and variety of survey equipments like tracing table, thermometers, barometer, magnetic compass, electric globe, anemometer, wind wane, standard time







indicator and wet and dry bulb thermometers. CDs related to different topics are also kept in the lab. Field trips are organised for the students to study the natural occupancy of various facts and inform about physical changes with the help of Global positioning system and Geographic information system available on Net. Geography Lab specializes in the development of qualitative and quantitative research skills in School.

COMPUTER LAB

The college Hostel provides a homely atmosphere for our borders. At present we have 40 seats in one hostel, Bhagabati Bhaban. In the College campus.

We provide facilities for our hostel boarders such as-spacious room aqua guard, indoor &outdoor game place and equipments, Medical facilities etc.



We have keen attention for security and discipline for our students. No boarder will be allowed to remain outside of the hostel after 6.00 p.m. They may leave the hostel on Saturday after college hours & on Sunday between 7.00 a.m and 11.00 a.m. between 2.00 p.m and 6.00 p.m. But they return before college hours Monday or before 6.30 p.m. on Sunday. None will be allowed to meet the boarders except those, whose name have been included in the visitors list. In emergent cases the superintendent may give a special permission even to those who are not recognized as visitors on production of a letter of permission from the guardian.

CANTEEN

The college canteen provides nutritious, varied and exciting meals and snacks to suit every taste. Food is always fresh and homemade, and uses the best locally-sourced ingredients.

Students who are eligible to receive free college meals can spend their allowance in here. The college's free breakfast scheme, which is available to all students, is also served in the canteen.

PLAY GROUND

As the college campus is very wide and spacious. The College presently have it's one own fields. Regular sports & games such as Volleyball, Football, Badminton & Cricket etc are conducted at these playgrounds. Regular games for hostel boarders (Ladies) are conducted at these playgrounds for 3 times in a week.

AUDITORIUM AND SEMINAR HALL

In this college we have a lavish auditorium possessing a seating capacity of 300. It is centrally air conditioned and equipped with incandescent lights, good acoustics, audio visual aids such as microphones, audio-video recording, video playback, slide projector, cue light system, audio - video feeds for camera crews, fixed talkback facility, additional talkback, head sets, video tripod etc. These facilities cater to multiple uses such as meetings of students and faculty members, convocations, presentations, short term training programs, workshops, conference, expert, guest lectures, cultural activities, celebrations, functions, gatherings etc. The seminar hall is spacious, well ventilated and furnished halls. It also offers facilities such as LCD and OHP projectors, screens, white-boards for delivering lectures.

E-LEARNING FACILITIES

Vidyasagar Teachers' Training College has its own servers that support Internet and webbased applications throughout the College. All students and staff have free access to the web through Wi-Fi and the College has an advanced filtering system that allows students to surf the web in a safe and secure manner. Students are allowed to bring their own tablets and laptops for independent study, but they must adhere to our IT and e-safety policy and respect teachers' policies on the use of technology during lessons. The College is developing its own Model system and classes generally adopt a blended learning approach, using YouTube and other sites or applications where these augment the learning experience. Our e-learning strategies are constantly being upgraded to reflect what works best for students, and that curriculum and specification-approved sites are used.
