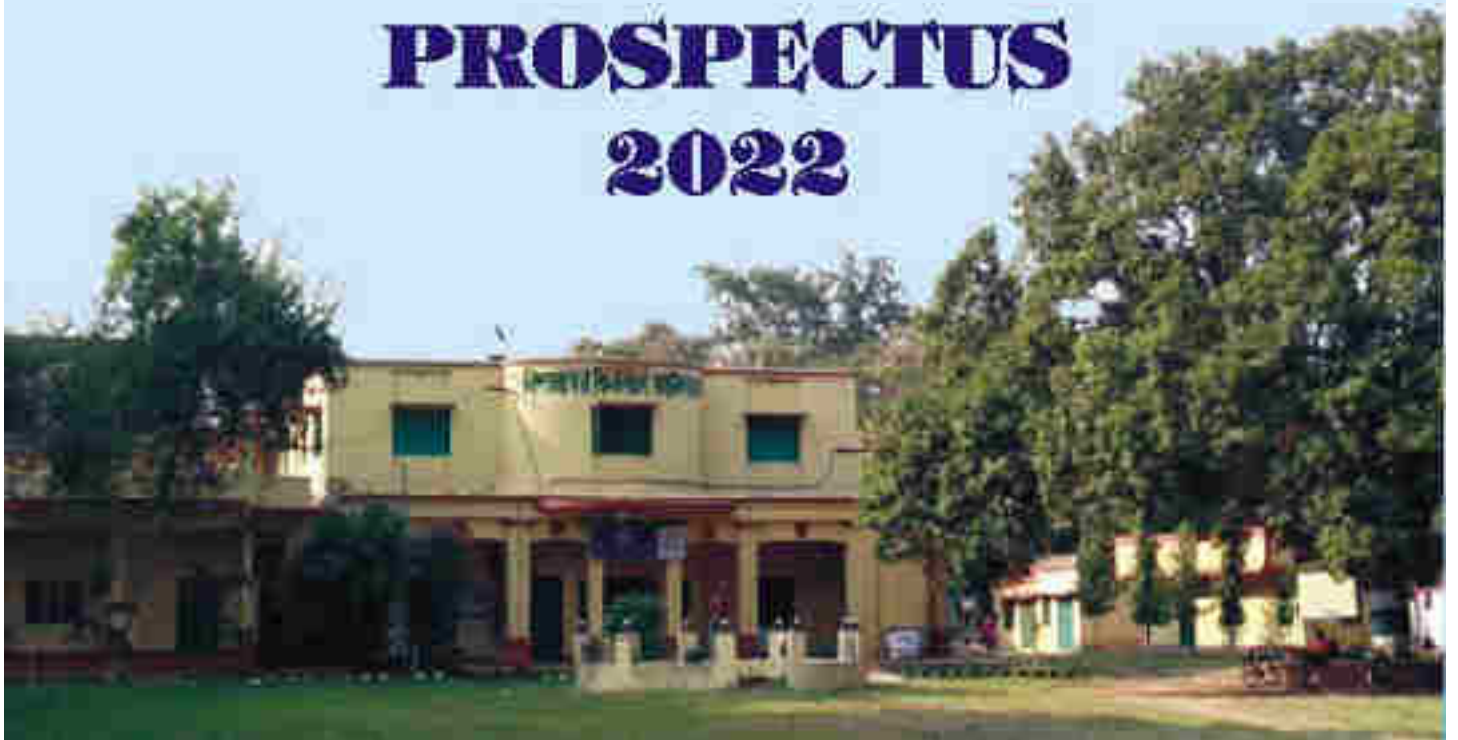

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## PREFACE

Vidyasagar Teachers' Training College (VTTC), named after Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, is situated in the heart of the Midnapore town of now Paschim Midnapore District. The history of the college began in 1966, when some ex-students of Midnapore College in their annual reunion visualized the necessity of improving the art of teaching. The said ex-students felt the need of establishment of a training college, which would impart training to the science teachers. They set up steering committee with the then District Magistrate as its chairman, the principal-secretary, Midnapore College as its convener secretary, a few ex-students of Midnapore College, a few elites, educationists of the town as its members. The consensus of discussions combined with untiring efforts resulted the college into being from the 1st July, 1968 with the sanction of affiliation in Arts and Science [co-educational] by the university of Calcutta with an intake of 220 [Deputed students-100 & Fresher students-120] trainees.

In 1969, the college purchased its own land of 1.78 acres from Smt. Nalini Dinda, w/o Sri Pulin Bihari Dinda at Burdge Town, Midnapore. From the 1st June, 1985, the college affiliated to the Vidyasagar University with the same Arts and Science subjects. Since its inception, the college is significantly engaged in training the teachers and would be teachers and has become one of the renowned training colleges in West Bengal.

The college has been affiliated by the UGC u/s 2(f) from its inception and considered eligible to receive central government assistance through UGC u/s 12B. The college has earned for itself, the reputation of bearing premier institution for teacher education in the state of West Bengal. The college has earned the recognition from the NCTE with effect from the academic session 2007-2008 for running the B.Ed. course with an intake of 100 Vide No. ERC/ 7-73. 6(c) 2/2007/6224 dated February 9, 2007. Validation of the B.Ed. degree u/s 1803 of the NCTE Act, 1993 has also been made for the students of this college who successfully completed the course from 1995-1996 to 2005-2006 Vide No. ERC/ WB-S/V-72/06/4846 (I) & ERC/ WB-S/V-72/06/4845 (I) dated 08 December, 2006.

## Admission for 2-years B.Ed. Course

1. For admission, the Institution follows the prevalent rules as prescribed by the NCTE Regulations, 2014 (published in the gazette of India: Extraordinary, Part III, Sec - 4, dated 01.12.2014).
2. Mode of admission is based on the total score obtained from his / her Secondary, H.S., UG, PG, M.Phil. / Ph.D.  
Candidates (both *Fresher* and *Deputed*) with at least 50% marks in aggregate either in Bachelor's Degree and/or in Master's Degree, for SC/ST/PH category 45% marks in aggregate either in Bachelor's Degree and/or in Master's Degree in Science / Social Science / Humanities or Bachelors in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics.
3. The available Method subjects:  
**Language group:** *Bengali, English, Sanskrit,*  
**Social Science group:** *History, Geography, Economics, Education,*  
**Science group:** *Physical Science and Life Science.*  
**Mathematics group:** *Mathematics.*  
**\*\* Students of Honours and PG are asked to fill only their respective Honours /PG subject.**  
Reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PH candidates shall be as per West Bengal Govt. rules. [SC-22%, ST-6%, OBC-A-10%, OBC-B-7%, PH-3%] OBC-A and OBC-B seats are reserved as per Kolkata Gazette Registered No. WB/SC/247 Dated 03.01.2014 vide clause-4(2).
4. Age of Fresher candidates as on every 30<sup>th</sup> June in every year would be less than 37 years (*relaxation as per West Bengal Government rules*).
5. Deputed Teachers: All the untrained teachers of **class V to Class XII** of Junior High/High/Higher Secondary Schools are eligible for admission with **at least two years** continuous against a permanent post or **three years** continuous service against an additional post as on service 30<sup>th</sup> June in every year according to the **GO 920/(24)- GA / OM/4/2011(Pt) dated 19.07.2016**. (Para Teacher/Primary Teachers are not eligible as Deputed Candidate)
6. Candidates pursuing any other course of Studies/Job/Full time Research work will not be allowed to pursue this course simultaneously.

### Total Seats

Total numbers of seats are 100, *Deputed candidates* 10% and *Fresher candidates* 90% according to the W.B.Govt. Order: No. 520-Edn (C.S.) / 10 M - 20/2015 dated 30.06.2022). If deputed seat lies vacant due to unavailability of deputed candidates that will be filled by fresher candidates. The candidates are requested to follow "Subject and Category wise Distribution of Seats" which will be uploaded in every session before publishing the final merit list.

### Application Fee

**For Online Payment:** Rupees 500/- (Rupees Five Hundred) for general category and Rupees 400/- (Rupees Four Hundred) for SC/ST/PH category students through Credit/Debit Card or Net banking. No application fee for Admission for this year due to COVID-19 Pandemic Situation according to West Bengal Govt. order.

### Course Fee

Last year the course fees was Rs. 25,000/ (Twenty Five thousand) for Fresher Students and Rs. 35,000/ (Thirty Five thousand) for Deputed Students. The fees may be retained same/raised/reduced in upcoming session and necessary information for the same will be duly informed.

Due to COVID-19 Pandemic situation last year Course Fees was Rs. 22,000/- and Rs. 32,000/- for fresher and deputed student respectively as per GB resolution.


### Rules and Regulations

Admission to the College implies an undertaking by the students to the effect that the students shall try their utmost to enhance the reputation of the college and shall willingly abide by the rules and disciplines of the college.

1. Online Admission System has been launched from the session 2015-2017 according to the W. B. Govt. order.

- Applications are to be submitted through online process only.
- Candidates should log-on college Website: [www.vttcollege.org.in](http://www.vttcollege.org.in)
- Guidelines for submissions of online applications are given on the website under “online admission” button.
- Merit lists will be published on the website on the due date.
- Selected candidates will pay admission fees through online payment system on the particular dates.
- Documents will be verified when the class will be start.
- Till registration in University the admission is provisional.
- Applicants can meet the “Help-Desk” in the college campus for any query during this admission procedure.



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- Applications for Hostel Seat (Women) would be submitted by the candidates on the day of counseling.
  - Residential certificate mentioning the approximate distance from the residence to the college from relevant authority.
  - Parents' income certificate from the relevant authority.
  - Hostel seats will be allotted through proper selection procedure on the basis of the seats available.
2. In admission portal applicant need to upload the following documents along with recent colour passport size photograph (25 kb in JPG format) and signature (25 kb in JPG format).
    - Mark sheet of Honours /Masters with 50 % marks (Marks relaxation as per Govt. Rules Category candidates).
    - Age proving certificate (Admit card of Madhyamik or equivalent exam/Certificate of Madhyamik exam).
    - Mark sheet of H.S. or equivalent exam from Board or Council.
    - Mark sheet of M.P. or equivalent exam from Board.
    - Caste certificate, if any
  3. The student must be accompanied by the guardians or the local guardian at the time of admission.
  4. The student migration from another University or Board will be provisionally admitted to the college.  
The migrating student must submit at the time of admission or within one month of their admission:
    - i. The original migration certificate from the University or the Board from which he /she is coming and
    - ii. An attested copy of the mark sheet of the last examination passed.

### **RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COLLEGE**

1. Admission fees are not generally refundable once admission is taken in the college.
2. All the students of the college must collect their identity cards from the office and must come to the college with their respective identity cards being duly signed by the student and countersigned by the principal of the college.
3. Discipline should be maintained in the college campus.
4. Use of mobile phone in the college campus is restricted and in classrooms strictly prohibited.
5. After admission, a student has to attend a minimum of theory and practical classes as per University rule.
6. No day-scholar will generally be allowed to leave the campus on week days before closing the all classes.

7. Day scholars are not allowed to enter the hostel building without prior permission of the Principal.
8. No student is allowed to meet their guardians, relatives in the campus without prior consent of the Principal.
9. During college hours, hostel boarders must stay in academic building according to class routine hours irrespective of whether they have any class or not. Disciplinary steps will be taken against those boarders who stay in the hostel but do not attend classes.
10. Library rules should be strictly followed.
11. Students are asked to use library reading room or common room without roaming in the campus.
12. Students should keep the Campus neat and clean.
13. Final Semester Mark sheet will be issued on submission of Library Clearance and Hostel Clearance Certificate.

## LAB FACILITIES

Laboratory is a place where anybody can experiment and explore patterns and ideas. We believe that the lab activities appeals to a wide range of learners, of different ages and varying proficiency. While the initial appeal is broad-based, the level of engagement of different individuals may vary. Keeping this foresight we wish to engage our student teachers in our enriched laboratories.

### A. MATHEMATICS LAB

Our institution has a functional Mathematics Laboratory which acts as a resource-cum-activity centre. The Mathematics Laboratory provides an opportunity for the trainees to discover mathematics through the principle of learning by doing. Trainee-teachers are encouraged to develop the basic ideas of foundations of mathematics and the general concept of space, as well as interactions between physics, mathematics and philosophy. This Laboratory contains various







teaching aids of mathematics which the trainees use to practice simulated lessons. The Laboratory also displays charts and models developed by trainees themselves in order to encourage their effort. The Laboratory through providing practical learning experiences also helps to develop the concept of interdisciplinary learning as learners understand how one discipline spills over to another and gets interrelated. The Laboratory also promotes scope of self-study and desires to develop research orientation among trainees.

### **B. LANGUAGE LAB**

The college has a modern Language Laboratory with state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment to aid in imparting language skills. The laboratory is effectively utilized by students and faculty members for various self-enhancement and soft skill development activities. This laboratory proves beneficial for those students who are poor in use of language. Students from rural areas who are generally weak in communication skills can have sufficient ear training in the language lab. It aims at confidence-building among students for interactions and presentations. The basic purpose of the lab is to provide students a platform to enhance language skills, communication skills and to practice soft skills. This lab is very effective in preparing the teacher trainees to invest in class preparation, skill analysis, experimenting and learning new methodologies.

- To equip the students with good communication skills.
- To emphasize the need of communication in the technical world.
- To prepare them for interviews and future job environments.
- To train the students in the art of conversation and discussion.
- Language Practice and Exercises.
- Vocabulary Building Skills.
- Active Listening Skills.
- Introduction to Phonetic Sounds.
- Reading Comprehension.



- Oral Presentations (Self Introduction, Extempore, Public Speech, Formal Presentation, Use of AV Aids, etc.).
- Mastering Presentation Tools (Microsoft Word & Power Point).
- Preparation of & Appearing for the Interview.
- Situational Conversations.
- Understanding Importance of Body Language.



### C. PHYSICS LAB

Science is different than other subjects. It is not just the subject of science that is different; the entire process of doing science is different. The means by which knowledge is



acquired is different in science than it is in history or mathematics or poetry or other subjects. Science is different because the answers to scientific questions are not found in a textbook or through pondering high and lofty thoughts. Indeed, scientist's ponder and hopefully think high and lofty thoughts; and indeed students in science class will find answers in a textbook. But the basis of what scientists believe and why they believe it is not the result of mere thinking or reading in a textbook. The basis of what scientists believe is the result of the careful collection and analysis of laboratory evidence. In any physics class, the differentness of science will be most evident when it comes time for lab. Our college has excellent Physics laboratory where the students are trained to enhance their practical skills in physics. The laboratory is fully equipped with complete set of latest equipment and tools, which caters to the need of the students and has experienced technical staff having necessary efficiencies. The lab is quite spacious and very well ventilated to ensure proper availability of light in it. The laboratory can accommodate 20 students conducting experiments in groups of two.

### D. CHEMISTRY LAB

Chemistry is essentially a practical oriented subject. No course in chemistry can be considered a complete without including some practical work in it. For proper understanding of chemistry, it should be taught using a large number of demonstration experiments. For carrying out demonstration experiments and for the performance of practical's by the students .a chemistry laboratory is a must for every teachers 'Training College offering physical Science a subject. Like other science subject a chemistry laboratory is justified on the following groups:





- For chemistry laboratory the required apparatus and other apparatus etc, can be safely stored.
- As in other science subjects so also in case of chemistry. Laboratories are helpful in creating and promoting scientific attitude in the pupils.
- Laboratory provides a proper and congenial place for performing experiments and is helpful in developing a sense of co-operation and spirit of healthy competition among the trainee teachers.

### **E. PSYCHOLOGY LAB**

Psychology as a subject is at the heart of every B.Ed. curriculum as without the knowledge of child psychology nobody can become a successful teacher. We have a considerable good collection of psychological tests such as Intelligence (Verbal, Non-Verbal and performance), Personality Inventory, Projective

These tests are useful for student-teachers to understand the process of conducting psychological experiments. The trainees can also use these standardized psychological tests in school situations during their Internship. We as teacher educators also use these scales to judge the entry level aptitude and personality of our trainees which further helps us to understand them better and adopt appropriate teaching strategies. The results of trainee teachers' performance are then shared with Guidance and Counselling Cell and Placement Cell so that they can guide future prospective teachers.

The college has to its credit a well equipped Life Science Laboratory .It has 12 compound Microscopes for each student. There are many glassware and chemicals which facilitate the learning process. The Laboratory is housed in a large room with enough practical tables and tools

The hostel is fully furnished and equipped with facilities for safe drinking water, dining space, open kitchen, medical facilities, security personnel and CCTV cameras. Entries and exits to the hostel are made as per the regulations of the hostel. The boarders have to strictly comply as per the rules of the hostel. No indiscipline is tolerated from the boarders.

- Boarders are not allowed to bring any visitors in the hostel.
- No boarder will be allowed to remain outside the hostel after 6.00 p.m. One may leave the hostel on Saturday after college hours and on Sunday between 7.00 a.m. to 11.00 a.m. or 2.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. The boarders are to return to the hostel before college hours either on Monday or before 6.30 p.m. on Sunday.
- No one will be allowed to meet the boarders except those, whose name have been included in the visitors list.
- In emergency cases the superintendent may give a special permission even to those who are not recognized







as visitors on production of a letter of permission from the guardian.

### CANTEEN

The college canteen provides nutrition, varied and exciting meals and snacks to suit every taste. Food is always fresh and homemade and use the best locally-sourced ingredients.



Students who are eligible to free college meals can spend their allowance in here, The colleges free breakfast scheme which is available to all students, is also served in the canteen.

### PLAY GROUND

As the college campus is very wide and spacious. The College presently have it's one own fields.




Regular sports and games such as Volleyball, Football, Badminton and Cricket etc are conducted at these playgrounds. Regular games for hostel boarders (Ladies) are conducted at these playgrounds for 3 times in a week.

### GARDEN

There are 6 gardens in our college, two in front of the college, and one in side by lawn towards college, one in outside of hostel, one in near the class hall 1 and other in hostel campus. The College has a lush green garden sprawling over a vast expanse of land. A wide variety of colourful annual and perennial flowering plants ferns, and cycas, are some of the many highlights of this garden. The front part of the garden looks attractive with several varieties of potted colourful annuals and is maintained by the college authority. The green campus with the lush green lawns. The garden has a very rich floral diversity with trees like *Mangifera*, *Eucalyptus*, *Arecaceae*, *Tectona grandis* and fruit plant also.

The College has a well-maintained Medicinal Plant Garden (Dhanwantari). It has different varieties of medicinal plants tagged with their biological nomenclature. The medicinal plants garden is unique in that almost every one of the species of plants and herb with a long history of use in folk tradition. We at our institute is developing a medicinal garden. Our college has 20 medicinal plants in medicinal gardens. The college has maintained a medicinal plant garden where





many plants of ethno medicinal importance have been grown. This is to sensitize the students about our traditional knowledge of herbal medicine and popularize the usefulness of commonly available and frequently used medicinal plants. It is also an attempt to conserve some rare and threatened species of medicinal plants.

### **AUDITORIUM AND SEMINAR HALL**

In this college we having a lavish auditorium possessing a seating capacity of 300. It is centrally air conditioned and equipped with incandescent lights, good acoustics, audio visual

aids such as microphones, audio-video recording, video playback, slide projector, cue light system, audio - video feeds for camera crews, fixed talkback facility, additional talkback, head sets, video tripod etc. These facilities



cater to multiple uses such as meetings of students and faculty members, convocations, presentations, short term training programs, workshops, conference, expert, guest lectures, cultural activities, celebrations, functions, gatherings etc. The seminar hall is spacious, well ventilated and furnished halls. It also offers facilities such as LCD and OHP projectors, screens, white-boards for delivering lectures.

### **E-LEARNING FACILITIES**

Vidyasagar teachers' training College has its own servers that support Internet and web-based applications throughout the College. All students and staff have free access to the web through Wi-Fi and the College has an advanced filtering system that allows students to surf the web in a safe and secure manner. Students are allowed to bring their own tablets and laptops for independent study, but they must adhere to our IT and e-safety policy and respect teachers' policies on the use of technology during lessons. The College is developing its own Model system and classes generally adopt a blended learning approach, using YouTube and other sites or applications where these augment the learning experience. Our e-learning strategies are constantly being upgraded to reflect what works best for students, and that curriculum and specification-approved sites are used.

From the session 2015-2016, the college campus is totally under the surveillance with 23 No. of C.C.T.V. monitoring system for the purpose of safety and security of students, staffs and assets of the college.

In the continuous process of learning we provide internet facility with wi fi service. Students can access e learning & reading materials from various education related websites.

### **HEALTH FACILITIES**

In the college hostel one registered doctor (Dr. Shinjan Patra, MBBS, MD(Med.)) is available twenty four hours. On emergency basis the doctor is also available for the day- scholars and one Gynecologist (Dr.Kanchan Kumar Dhara, MBBS, MS (G&O), and MRCOG-1 (Lond.) visit one day in a week for Hostel Boarders. Each department has First-Aid facilities. The college has tie-





up with Nirnoy Diagnostic Centre for treatment and pathological testing.

It brings together physical and mental disciplines to achieve a peaceful body and mind; it helps manage stress and anxiety and keeps you relaxing. It also helps in increasing flexibility, muscle strength and body tone. It improves respiration, energy and vitality. 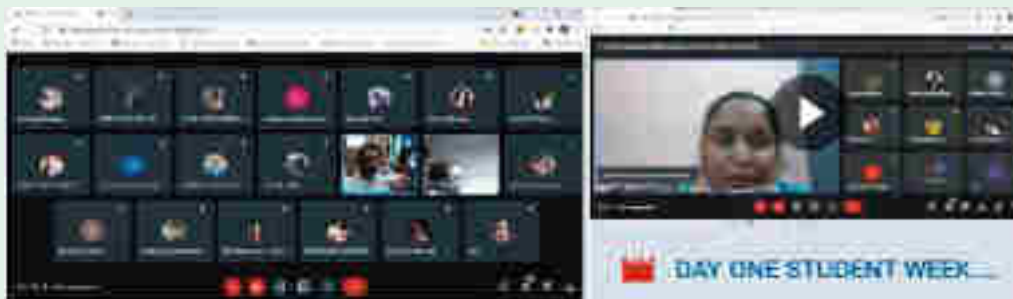

### COLLEGE MAGAZINE

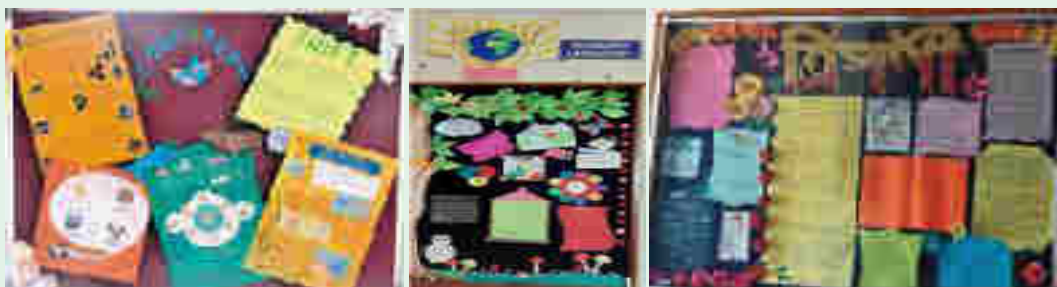
