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## PREFACE

Vidyasagar Teachers' Training College (VTTC), named after Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, is situated in the heart of the Midnapore town of now Paschim Midnapore District. The history of the college began in 1966, when the ex-students of Midnapore College in their annual reunion visualized the necessity of improving the art of teaching. The said ex-students felt the need of establishment of a training college, which would impart training to the science teachers. They set up steering committee with the then District Magistrate as its chairman, the principal-secretary, Midnapore College as its convener secretary, a few ex-students of Midnapore College, a few elites, educationists of the town as its members. The consensus of discussions combined with untiring efforts resulted the college into being from the 1st July, 1968 with the sanction of affiliation in Arts and Science [co-educational] by the university of Calcutta with an intake of 220 [Deputed students-100 & Fresher students-120] trainees.

In 1969, the college purchased its own land of 1.78 acres from Smt. Nalini Dinda, w/o Sri Pulin Bihari Dinda at Burdge Town, Midnapore. From the 1st June, 1985, the college affiliated to the Vidyasagar University with the same Arts and Science subjects. Since its inception, the college is significantly engaged in training the teachers and would be teachers and has become one of the renowned training colleges in West Bengal.

The college has been affiliated by the UGC u/s 2(f) from its inception and considered eligible to receive central government assistance through UGC u/s 12B. The college has earned for itself, the reputation of bearing premier institution for teacher education in the state of West Bengal. The college has earned the recognition from the NCTE with effect from the academic session 2007-2008 for running the B.Ed. Course with an intake of 100 Vide No. ERC/7-73. 6(c) 2/2007/6224 dated February 9, 2007. Validation of the B.Ed. degree u/s 1803 of the NCTE Act, 1993 has also been made for the students of this college who successfully completed the course from 1995-1996 to 2005-2006 Vide No. ERC/ WB-S/V-72/06/4846 (I) & ERC/ WB-S/V-72/06/4845 (I) dated 08<sup>th</sup> December, 2006.

2. Mode of admission is based on the total score obtained from his/her Secondary. H.S., HG, PG, M.Phil./Ph.D.

Candidates (both Fresher and Deputed) with at least 50% marks in aggregate either in Bachelor's either in Bachelor's Degree and/ or in Master's Degree in Science / Social Science / Humanities or Bachelors in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics.

Deputed Teachers : All the untrained teachers of class V to Class XII of Junior High/High/Higher Secondary Schools are eligible for admission with at least two years continuous against a permanent post or three Years continuous service against an additional post as on service 30th June in every year according to the GO 920(24)-GA/OM/4/2011 (G.O) dated 19.07.2016 (Para Teacher/Primary Teachers are not eligible as Deputed Candidate)
6. Candidates pursuing any other course of Studies / Job/ Full time Research work will not be allowed to pursue this course simultaneously.
7. Total numbers of seats are 100. Deputed candidates 10% and Fresher candidates 90% according to the W.B. Govt. Order: No. 520 Edn(C.S)/ 10M- 20/2015 dated 30.06.2022 as per Govt Rules. If deputed seat lies vacant due to unavailability of deputed candidates that will be filled by fresher candidates. The candidates are requested to follow "Subject and Category wise Distribution of Seats" which will be uploaded in every session before publishing the final merit list.

## LAB FACILITIES

Laboratory is a place where anybody can experiment and explore patterns and ideas. We believe that the lab activities appeal to a wide range of learners, of different ages and varying proficiency. While the initial appeal is broad-based, the level of engagement of different individuals may vary. Keeping this foresight we wish to engage our student teachers in our enriched laboratories.

### 1. MATHEMATICS LAB :

Our institution has a functional Mathematics Laboratory which acts as a resource-cum-activity centre. The Mathematics Laboratory provides an opportunity for the trainees to discover mathematics through the principle of learning by doing. Trainee- teachers are encouraged to develop the basic idea of foundations of mathematics and the general concept of space, as well as interactions between physics, mathematics and philosophy. This Laboratory contain various teaching



teaching aids of mathematics which the trainees use to practise simulated lessons. The Laboratory also displays charts and models developed by trainees themselves in order to encourage their effort. The Laboratory through providing practical learning experiences also helps to develop the concept of interdisciplinary learning as learners understand how one discipline over to another and gets interrelated. The Laboratory also promotes scope of self-study and desires to develop research orientation among trainees.

### 2. LANGUAGE LAB :

The College has a modern Language Laboratory with state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment to aid in imparting language skills. The laboratory is effectively utilized by students and faculty members for various self-enhancement and soft skill development activities. This laboratory proves beneficial for those students who are poor in use of language. Students from rural areas who are generally weak in communication skills can have sufficient ear training in the language lab. It aims at confidence-building among students a platform to enhance language skills, communication skills and to practise soft skills. This lab is very effective in preparing the teacher trainees to invest in class preparation, skill analysis, experimenting and learning new methodologies.







## 2. PHYSICS LAB ::

Science is different than other subjects. It is not just the subject of science that is different; the entire process of doing science is different. The means by which knowledge is acquired is different in science than it is in history or mathematics or poetry or other subjects. Science is different because the answers to scientific questions are not found in a textbook or through pondering high and lofty thoughts. Indeed, scientists ponder and hopefully think high and lofty thoughts; and indeed students in science class will find answers in a textbook. But the basis of what scientists believe and why they believe it is not the result of mere thinking or reading in a textbook. The basis of what scientists believe is the result of the careful collection and analysis of laboratory evidence. In any physics class, the difference of science will be most evident when it comes time for lab. Our college has excellent Physics laboratory where the students are trained to enhance their practical skills in physics. The laboratory is fully equipped with complete set of latest equipment and tools, which caters to the need of the students need has experienced technical staff having necessary efficiencies. The lab is quite spacious and very well ventilated to ensure proper availability of light in it. The laboratory can accommodate 20 students conducting experiments in groups of two.



## 4. CHEMISTRY LAB :

Chemistry is essentially a practical oriented subject. No course in chemistry can be considered a complete without including some practical work in it. For proper understanding of chemistry, it should be taught using a large number of demonstration experiments. For carrying out demonstration experiments and for the performance of practicals by the students a chemistry laboratory is a must for every Teachers' Training College offering physical Science as a method subject. Like other science subject a chemistry laboratory is justified on the following groups:





- For Chemistry laboratory the required apparatus and other apparatus etc., can safely stored.
- As in other science subjects so also in case of Chemistry Laboratories are helpful in creating and promoting scientific attitude in the pupils.
- Laboratory provides a proper and congenial place for performing experiments and is helpful in developing a sense of co-operation and spirit of healthy competition among the trainee teachers.

### 5. PSYCHOLOGY LAB :

Psychology as a subject is at the heart of every B.Ed. Curriculum as without the knowledge of child psychology nobody can become a successful teacher. We have a considerable good collection of psychological tests such as Intelligence (Verbal, Non-Verbal and performance), Personality Inventory, Projective Technique, Creativity Tests, Social Economic Scale, Achievement and Achievement Motivaitonal Tests, Study Habit Scales, Self-Concept Scale and Attitude Scale etc in our laboratory.



These tests are useful for student-teachers to understand the process of conducting psychological experiments. Trainees can also use these standardized psychological tests in school situations during their Internship. We as teacher educators also use these scales to judge the entry level aptitude and personality of our trainees which further helps us to understand them better and adopt appropriate teaching strategies. The results of trainee teachers' performance are then shared with Guidance and Counselling Cell and Placement Cell so that they can guide future prospective teachers.

### 6. LIFE SCIENCE LAB :

The college has to its credit a well equipped Life Science Laboratory. It has 12 compound Microscopes for each student. There are many glasswares and chemicals which facilitate the learning process. The Laboratory is housed in a large room with enough practical tables and tools learning process. There is a steady Wi-Fi connectivity inside the laboratory. The atmosphere inside the Life Science Laboratory created a vibrant environment conforming to the four pillars of education that is "Learning to do, learning to know, learning to be and leaning to live together."



## 7. GEOGRAPHY LAB :

Geography lab plays a pivotal role in enriching geographical base of a student-a necessary part of learning that exposes students to full spectrum of disciplinary subfields-physical, human and nature-society geography as well as geographical techniques. The college has to its credit a well equipped Life Science Laboratory. It has 12 compound Microscopes for each student. There are many glasswares and chemicals which facilitate the learning process. The Laboratory is housed in a large room with enough practical tables and tools inside the Life Science Laboratory created spirited environment conforming to the four pillars of education that is "Learning to do, learning to know, learning to be and leaning to live together."



series of maps, topographic sheets and variety of survey equipments like tracing table, thermometers, barometer, magnetic compass, indicator and wet and dry bulb thermometers. Field trips are organised for the students to study the natural occupancy of various facts and inform about physical changes with the help of Global Positioning System and Geographic Information System available on Net. Geography Lab specializes in the development of qualitative and quantitative research skills in college.

## 8. HISTORY ROOM :

### 9. ICT LAB :

Our ICT laboratory was recently renovated and upgraded to facilitate our learners. We have about 26 desktop sets in the laboratory with strong LAN connection. There is an Over Head Projector and whiteboard for the teacher educators to instruct the learners. The laboratory is useful for B.Ed. trainee teachers as they get to learn the digital know how and technicalities of computers and use of ICT in education. It helps trainee teachers to become competent and confident users of technology and use the basic knowledge and skills acquired in the teaching learning process. The trainees also use the laboratory for making various practicum starting from simple powerpoint to more complex ones (BLOG preparation). Our institution also uses this laboratory to organise special classes on ICT.

integrated in the fabric of the curriculum. In the two year B.Ed. programme, the EPC on ICT builds the theoretical and practical base for the learners. Each student and faculty member is given a separate user ID which is password protected that ensures secure connectivity. They are encouraged to incorporate audio/vidio clips in their lesson plans. Use of ICT in enabling the students in creating their own AVs using digital cameras or smart phones is another addition to the repertoire of means for enriching teaching. The students are encouraged to use their smart-phones to video-shoot the relevant visuals/sequences focusing academic concerns.

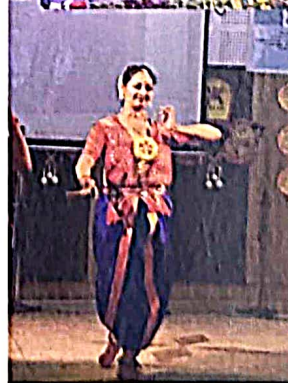
## DANCE :

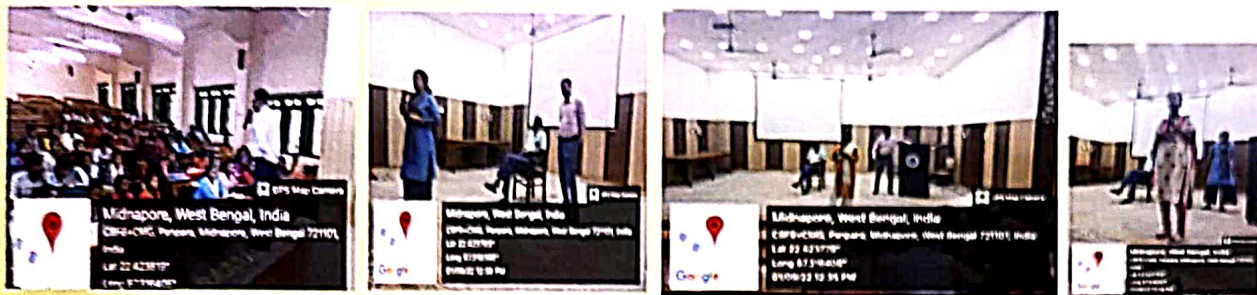






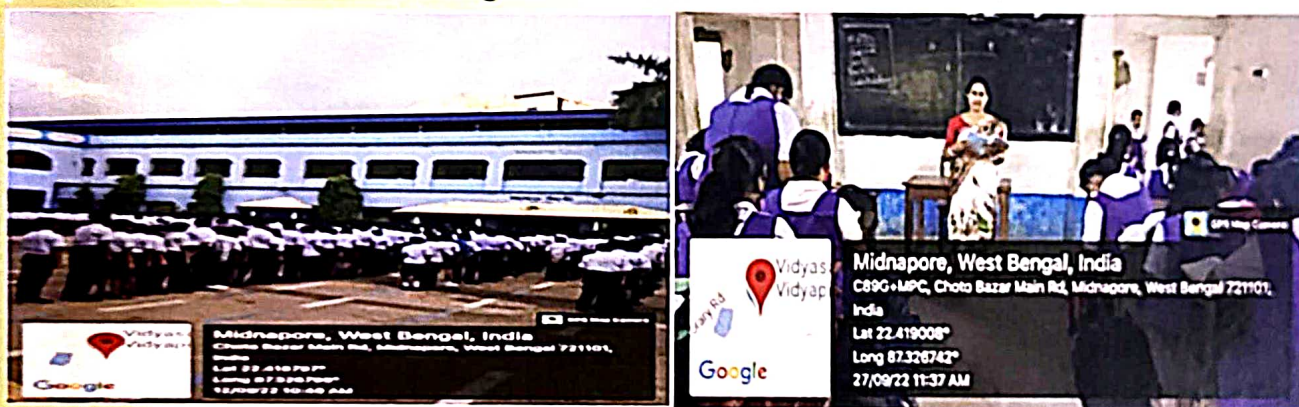
**Orientation for Teaching Interns : 01.09.2022-02.09.2022**

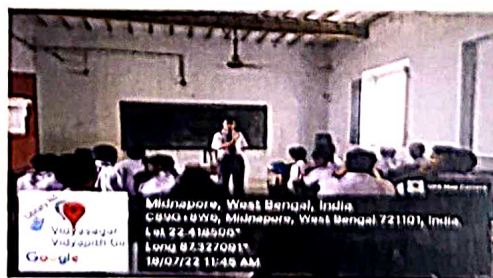
**School Internship: 03.09.2022-20.12.2022**

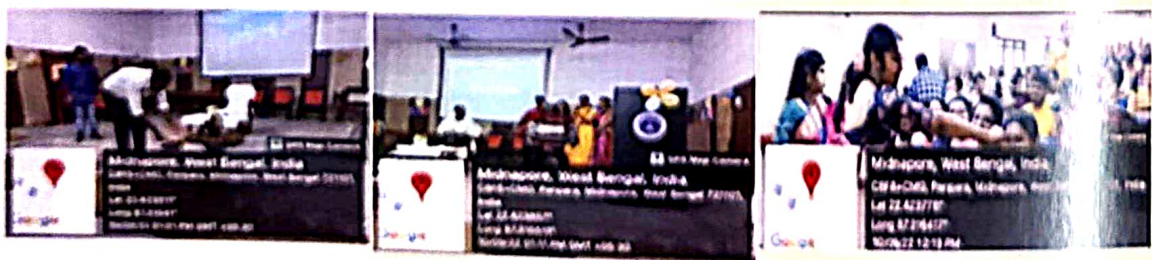
### Cleanliness and Dengue Awareness Programme

### Farewell programme (2020-2022)

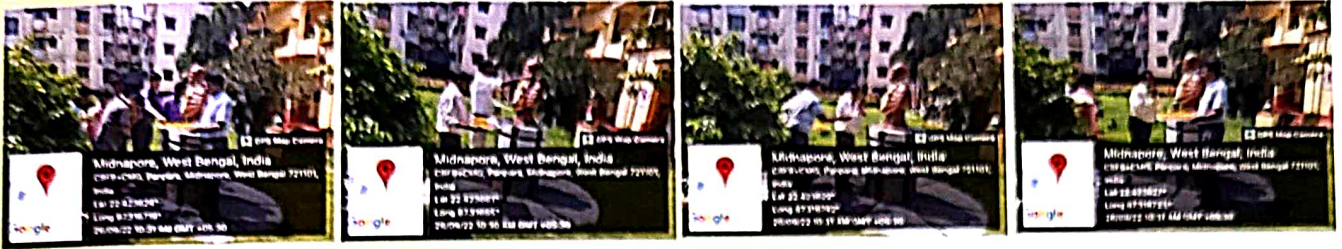

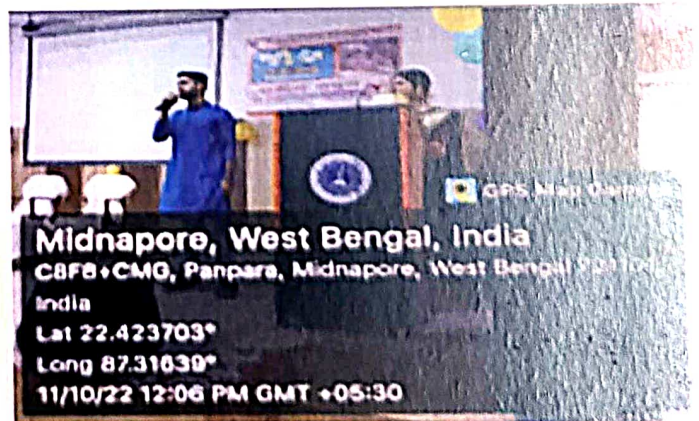
### *Saradiya Celebration*

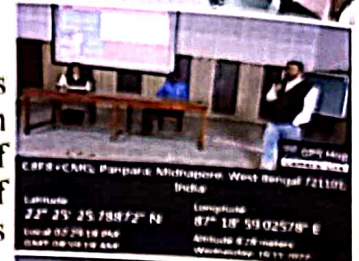
## Children's Day

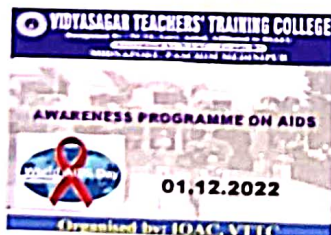


## J.C.Bose Birthday Celebration

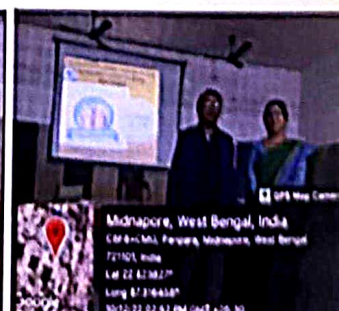
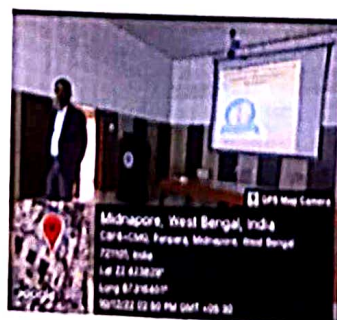

### Workshop on Geography

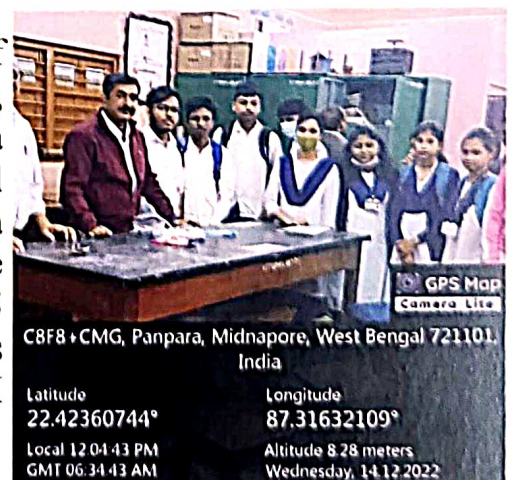

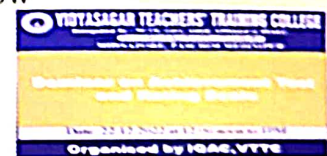
### ***Career Counselling Programme***

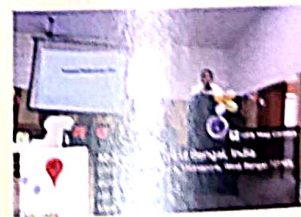
### ***Seminar on Achievement Test and Rating Scale***

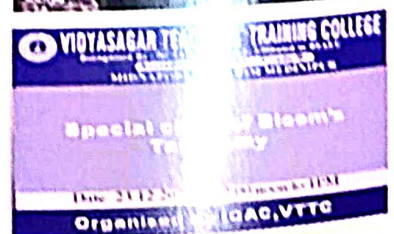
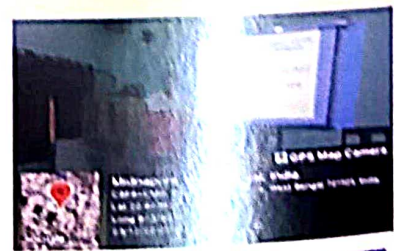
### ***National Mathematics Day Celebration***

### ***Special Lecture on Bloom Taxonomy***

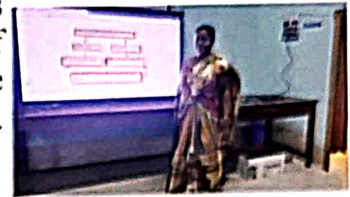
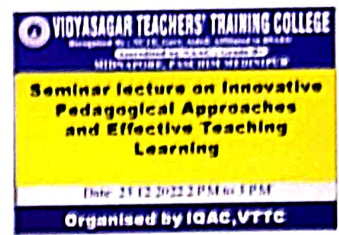

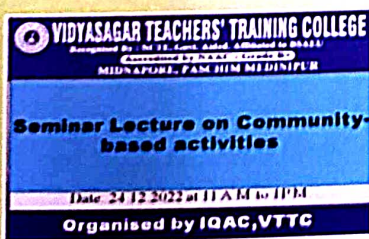
### Hands on Practice and TLM Making

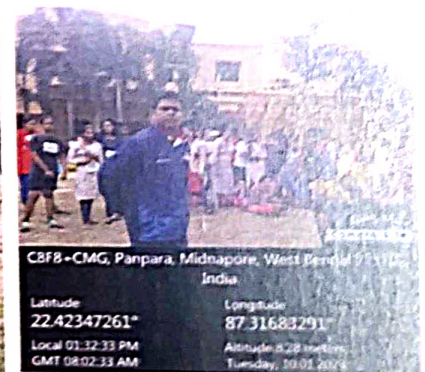
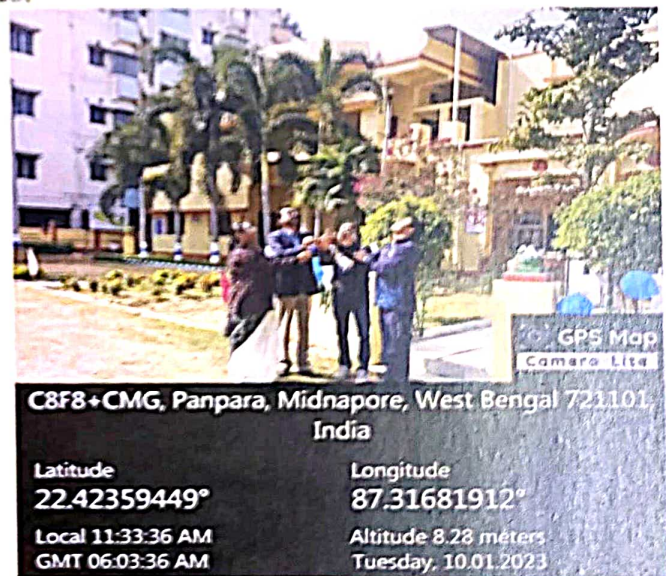
### *In-house Seminar by Students : "Creativity and related concepts"*

## Inauguration of Computer Course (Add on Course)

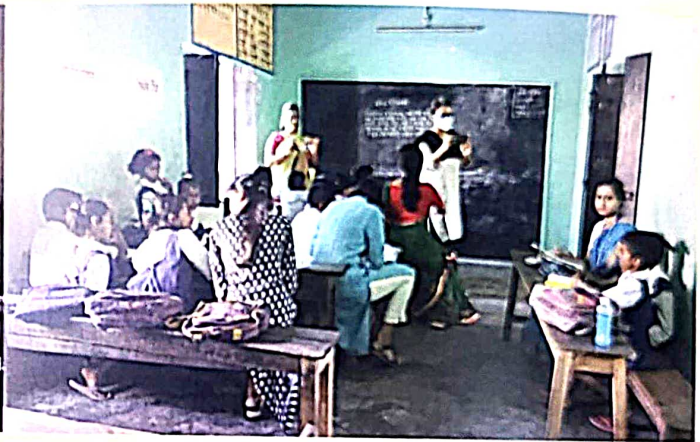

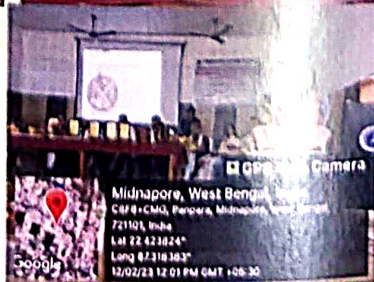
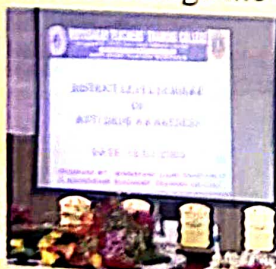


## District Level Seminar on Anti-Drug Awareness

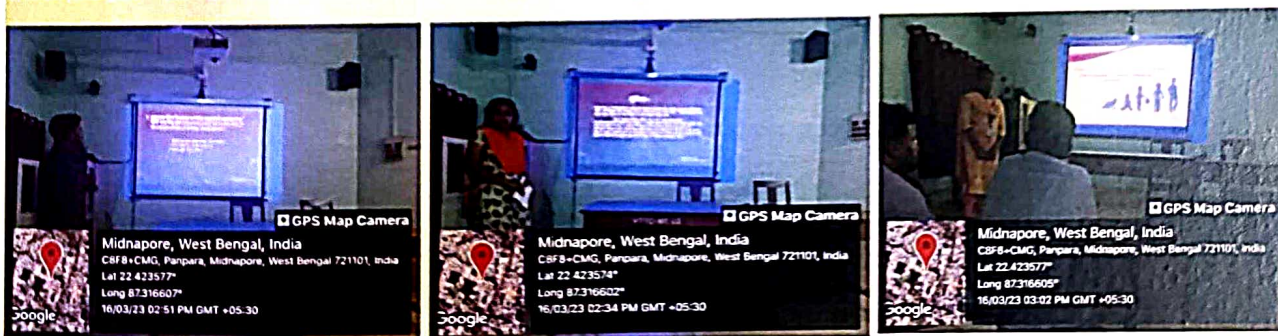
### Field visit on Polytechnic College

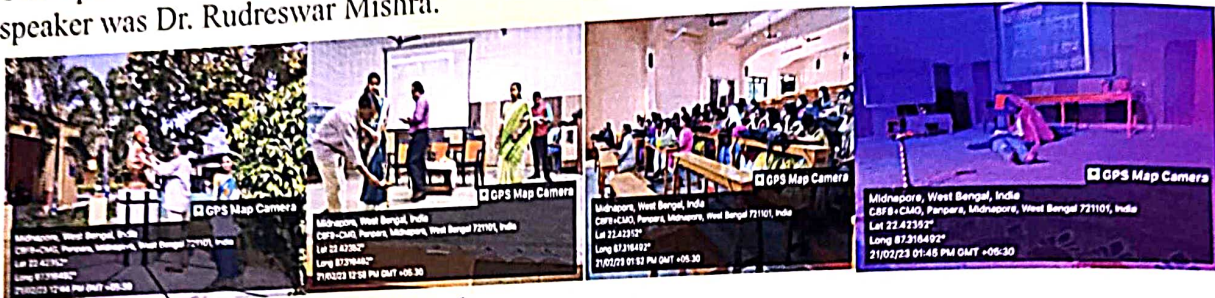

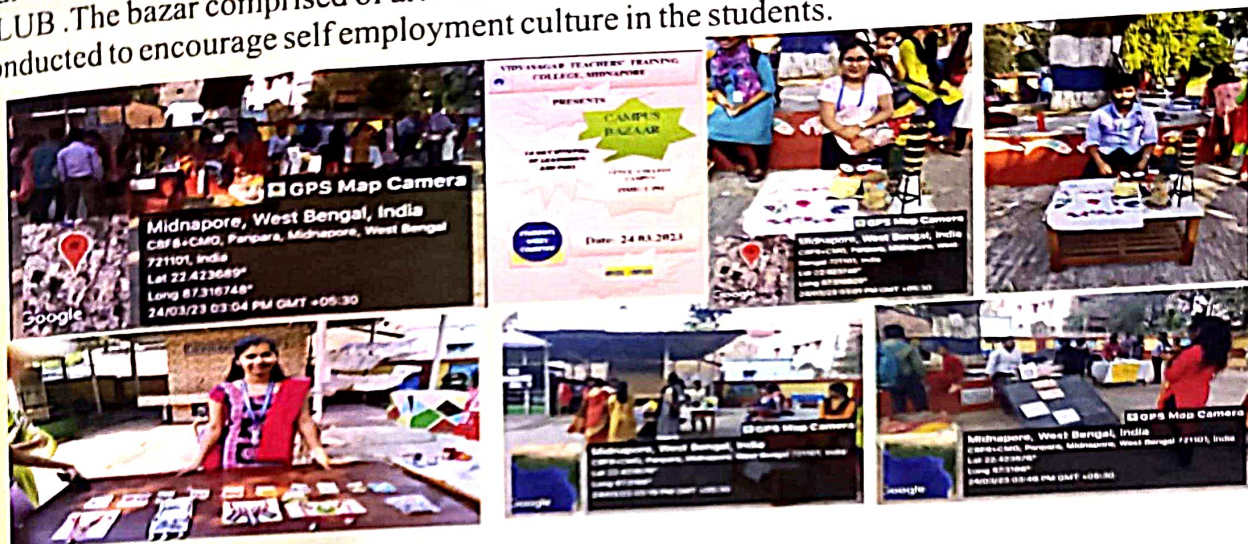

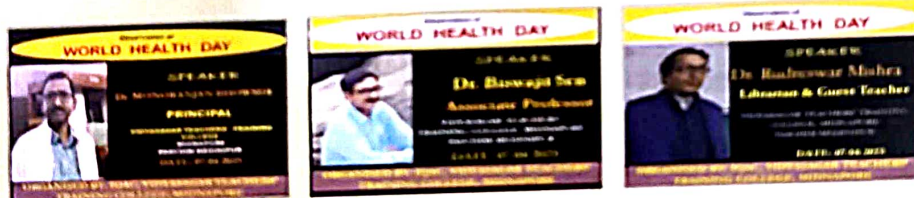
## Campus Bazar

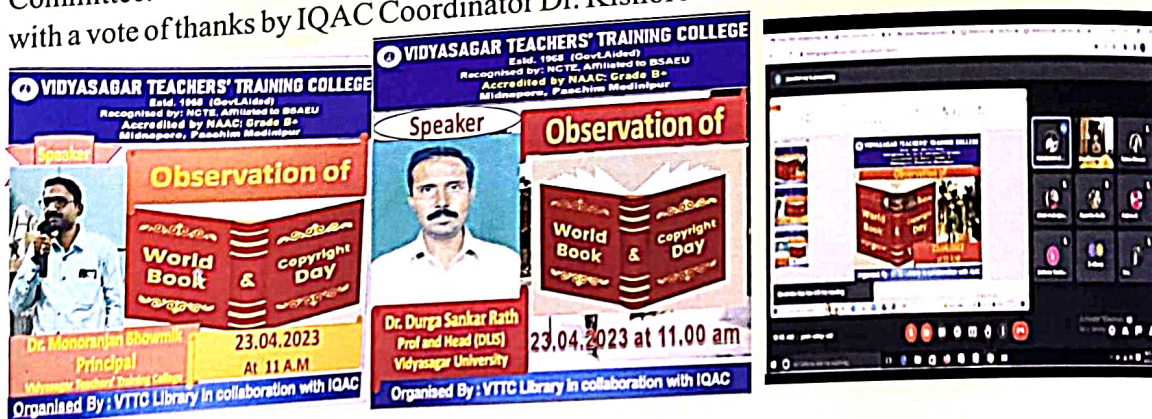


## World Book Day Celebration

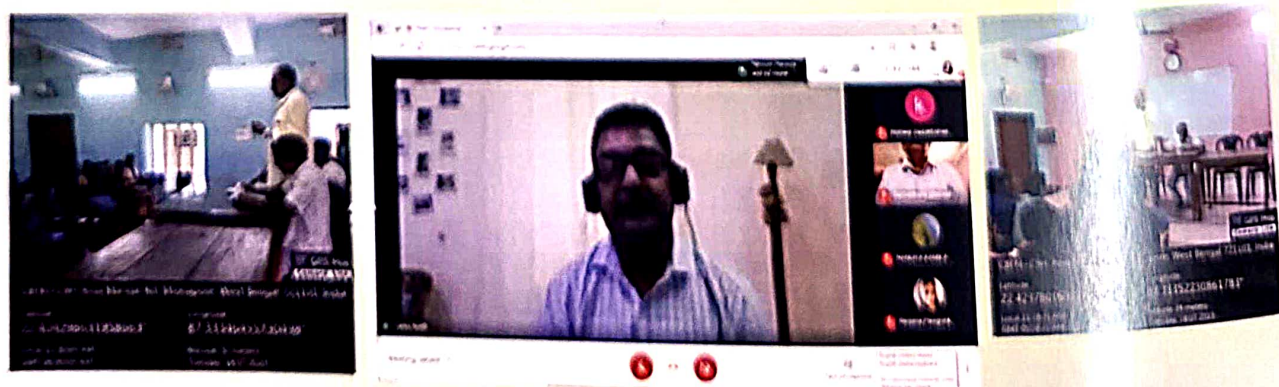


**Field Visit of Polluted site (Outreach Activity)**

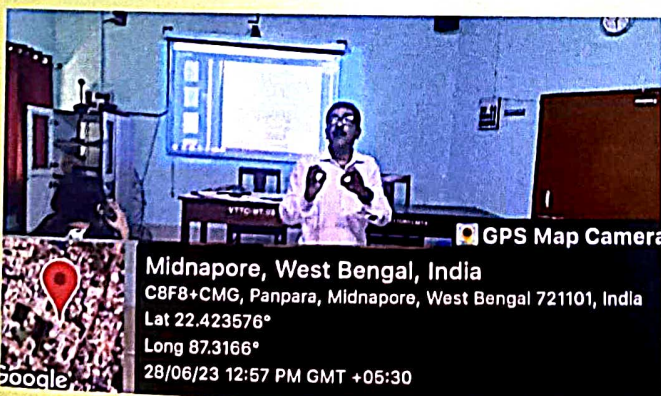
### International Yoga Day Celebration

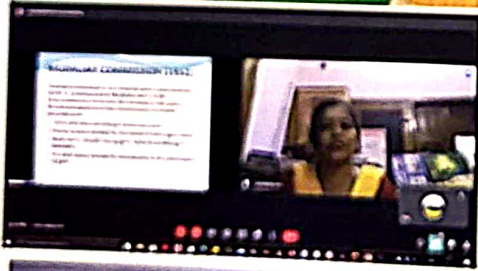

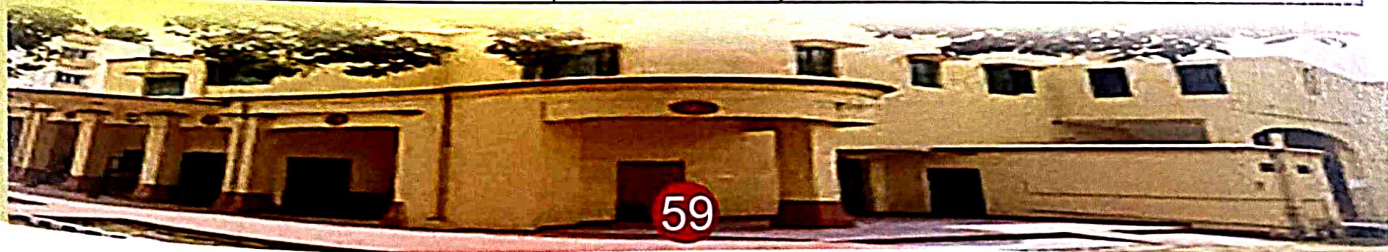

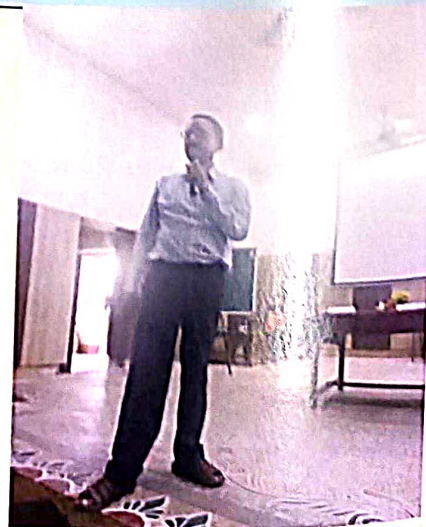

**UGC ANTI-RAGGING REGULATIONS (Clauses 3, 7 and 9.1)**  
**CLAUSE 3: Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:**

- a. any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- b. indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c. asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- d. any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f. any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g. any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h. any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i. any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

**CLAUSE 7: Action to be taken by the Head of the institution.** - On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti-Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- i. Abetment to ragging; Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- ii. Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- iii. Public nuisance created during ragging; Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- iv. Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt; Wrongful restraint; Wrongful confinement; Use of criminal force; Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences; Extortion;
- v. Criminal trespass; Offences against property;
- vi. Criminal intimidation; Attempts to commit any or all of the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- vii. Threat to commit any or all of the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s); Physical or psychological humiliation and all other offences following from the definition of "Ragging".

Provided that the Head of the institution shall forthwith report the occurrence of the incident of ragging to the District Level Anti-Ragging Committee and the Nodal officer of the affiliating University, if the institution is an affiliated institution. Provided further that the institution shall also continue with its own enquiry initiated under clause 9 of these Regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police/local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of seven days of the reported occurrence of the incident of ragging.

**CLAUSE 9.1 : The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under;**

- a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
  - i. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
  - ii. Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process, Withholding results.
  - iii. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel, Cancellation of admission.
  - iv. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
  - v. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- c) An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie, in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor and in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution,
