## **Preface**

Vidyasagar Teachers' Training College (VTTC), named after Pandit Iswar Chandra Vidyasagar, now Paschim Medinipur, is situated in the heart of the Midnapore town. The history of the college began in 1966, when the ex-students of Midnapore College in their annual reunion visualized the necessity of improving the art of teaching. Though a training college and a few training departments in the general colleges were imparting training to the teachers and would be teachers of the Junior-high, High & Higher Secondary Schools of the then undivided district, there was no provision for the training of science teachers. The said ex-students felt the need of establishment of a training college, which would impart training to the science teachers. They set up steering committee with the then District Magistrate as its chairman, the Principal-Secretary, Midnapore College as its Convener Secretary, a few ex-students of Midnapore College, a few elites, educationists of the town as its members. The consensus of discussions combined with untiring efforts resulted the college into being from the 1st July, 1968 with the sanction of affiliation in Arts and Science [co-educational] by the University of Calcutta with an intake of 220 [Deputed students-100 & Fresher students-120] trainees.

In 1969, the college purchased its own land of 1.78 acres from Smt. Nalini Dinda, w/o Sri Pulin Bihari Dinda at Burdge Town, Midnapore. From the 1st June, 1985, the college was affiliated to the Vidyasagar University with the same Arts and Science subjects. Since its inception, the college is significantly engaged in training the Teachers and would be teachers and has become one of the renowned Training Colleges in West Bengal.

The college has been affiliated by the UGC u/s 2(f) from its inception and considered eligible to receive central Government assistance through UGC u/s 12B. The college has earned for itself, the reputation of bearing premier institution for teacher education in the state of West Bengal. The college has earned the recognition from the NCTE with effect from the academic session 2007-2008 for running the B.ED. Course with an intake of 100 Vide No. ERC/7-73. 6(c) 2/2007/6224 dated February 9, 2007. Validation of the B.Ed. degree u/s 1803 of the NCTE Act, 1993 has also been made for the students of this college who successfully completed the course from 1995-1996 to 2005-2006 Vide No. ERC/WB-S/V-72/06/4846 (I) & ERC/WB-S/V-72/06/4845 (I) dated 08, 2006.

**Admission for two years B.Ed Course**

1. For admission, the Institution follows the prevalent rules as prescribed by the NCTE Regulations, 2014 (published in the gazette of India: Extraordinary, Part III, Sec - 4, dated 01.12.2014).

2. Mode of admission is based on the total score obtained from his / her Secondary, H.S., UG, PG, M.Phil. / Ph.D.Candidates (both Fresher and Deputed) with at least 50% marks in aggregate either in Bachelor's Degree and/or in Master's Degree, for SC/ST/PH category 45% marks in aggregate either in Bachelor's Degree and/or in Master's Degree in Science / Social Science / Humanities or Bachelors in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics.

3. The available Method subjects:

- Language group** : *Bengali, English, Sanskrit,*
- Social Science group** : *History, Geography, Economics, Education,*
- Science group** : *Physical Science and Life Science.*
- Mathematics group** : *Mathematics.*

\*\* Students of Honours and PG are asked to fill only their respective Honours /PG

**Subject**

Reservation of seats for SC/ST/OBC-A/OBC-B/PH candidates shall be as per West Bengal Govt. rules. [SC-22%, ST-6%, OBC-A-10%, OBC-B-7%, PH-3%] OBC-

4. Age of Fresher candidates as on every 30-June in every year would be less than 37years (*relaxation as per West Bengal Government rules*).
5. Deputed Teachers: All the untrained teachers of **class V to Class XII** of Junior High / High / Higher Secondary Schools are eligible for admission with **at least two years** continuous against a permanent post or **three years** continuous service against an additional post as on service 30-June in every year according to the **GO 920/(24)-GA/ OM/4/2011(Pt) dated 19.07.2016**. (Para Teacher/Primary Teachers are not eligible as Deputed Candidate)
6. Candidates pursuing any other course of Studies/Job/Full time Research work will not be allowed to pursue this course simultaneously.

### Total Seats

Total numbers of seats are 100, *Deputed candidates 10% and Fresher candidates 90%* according to the W.B.Govt. Order: No. 520-Edn (C.S.) / 10 M - 20/2015 dated 30.06.2022). If deputed seat lies vacant due to unavailability of deputed candidates that will be filled by fresher candidates. The candidates are requested to follow "Subject and Category wise Distribution of Seats" which will be uploaded in every session before publishing the final merit list.

  - During admission time have to be pay 1st year fees and in next year in the month of July have to pay 2nd year fees [No provision of instalment/partial payment].
  - Applicant can meet the "Help-Desk" in the college campus for any query during this admission procedure.
  - Parent's income certificate from the relevant authority.
  - Hostel seats will be allotted through proper selection procedure on the basic of the seats available

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



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

Keeps a continuous vigil over the important corners of the campus vulnerable to incidence of ragging specially the Hostels.

## UGC ANTI-RAGGING REGULATIONS (Clauses 3, 7 and 9.1)

### CLAUSE 3: Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:

- any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student ;
- any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

**CLAUSE 7: Action to be taken by the Head of the institution.**- On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti-Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- Abetment to ragging; Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- Public nuisance created during ragging; Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt; Wrongful restraint; Wrongful confinement; Use of criminal force; Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences; Extortion;
- Criminal trespass; Offences against property;
- Criminal intimidation; Attempts to commit any or all of the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- Threat to commit any or all of the above-mentioned offences against the victim(s); Physical or psychological humiliation and all other offences following from the definition of “Ragging”.

Provided that the Head of the institution shall forthwith report the occurrence of the incident of ragging to the District Level Anti-Ragging Committee and the Nodal officer of the affiliating University, if the institution is an affiliated institution. Provided further that the institution shall also continue with its own enquiry initiated under clause 9 of these Regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police/local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of seven days of the reported occurrence of the incident of ragging.

### CLAUSE 9.1 : The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed herein under:

- The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
  - Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
  - Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process, Withholding results.
  - Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel, Cancellation of admission.
  - Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie, in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor and in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution,

## Sexual Harassment Cell

As per the guidelines of UGC and the Supreme Court an Anti Sexual Harassment Cell has been established by the college to provide a healthy and congenial atmosphere to the staff and students of the college. The Cell was constituted to meet the basic objectives

To develop the guidelines and norms for a policy against sexual harassment

To work out details for the implementation of the policy

To prepare a detailed plan of action, both short and long term.


### International Seminar
